As the Secretary of the Navy, I am strongly committed to preserving the Department of the Navy's (DON) principles of Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO). Preventing, halting, and remedying all forms of discrimination, harassment, and reprisal within the DON is essential to our organizational success.
