



# ENVIRONMENTAL RECYCLING PROGRAM

- Qualified Recycling Program (QRP)
- Self Sufficient / unfunded program
- Direct Sales Authority
- Support DLA - Disposition Service (DS) function
- Customers can turn in scrap equipment to QRP:
  - If turn-in of the items to the QRP is the most cost efficient means of disposition/disposal.
  - If items vetted through their service process and all avenues for reutilization/transfer have been exhausted, or a cost benefit analysis was conducted.

## Color Coded Recycling Bins/Cages/Skips

(Indoors/Outdoors)

- Blue: Paper/Cardboard
- Yellow: Plastic
- Red: Aluminum Cans
- Green Metal Skip: Scrap Metals
- Green Cage: Styrofoam



- Recycle Drop off point for recyclables from home (by NEX & Pass /ID)



## NSA RECYCLES

- Scrap Metals
- Mixed Paper/Cardboard
- Plastic Bottles/Plastic bags/wraps
  - Aluminum Cans
  - Toner Cartridges
  - Expended Brass
  - Styrofoam
- Lead Acid Batteries
  - Used Oil/Fuel
- Electrical scrap/cables
  - Scrap equipment
- Construction Debris- metal/steel bars
- E waste (except data/memory storage)

**Note#** No Shredded / Pulverized Paper, No Food and Hazmat Contaminated items

### Hazardous Waste Mgmt.:

Recycling: Used POL, Aerosol Cans, Lead Acid Batteries, Empty Cans, drained filters

**Cost Avoidance: ~ \$1-2M/Year**

### Solid Waste Recycling:

Scrap Metal, Aluminum cans, Plastic (Bottles, wraps, shopping bags), Paper, Cardboard, Styrofoam, Toner Cartridges, E-waste

Construction & Demolition Debris

**Cost Avoidance: ~1-1.5 M/Year**

### QRP Proceeds: ~180-200K / Year

Proceeds from the QRP are reinvested into the Installation.
