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Dental Clinic:

Any dates upcoming where cleanings will be opened up to dependent spouses? In the past they occasionally open a limited schedule for this purpose.

Not currently. These aren't scheduled or planned. There will occasionally be a few days when schedules open up, and we can offer these last-minute appointments. When this happens, it's for a very limited time (1-3 days).



Safety:

For WildCats and Pets, is the Command willing to review and clarify the “new pet policy” signed by our former CO? There are many points lacking in clarity regarding escalation of safety events or severity of infractions.

The short answer is absolutely, yes. I am always open to reviewing our policies to ensure they are clear, fair, and contribute to a safe and positive community environment. If a policy is creating confusion or unnecessary worry, then it's not serving its purpose effectively.

To address your concerns directly, I've reviewed the current policy (NAVSUPPACTNAPLESINST 10570.2J) to identify the areas that govern safety and infractions. Specifically:

- **Section 7.a** defines what constitutes a "nuisance," which ranges from incessant barking to bite incidents.
- **Section 7.b** outlines the reporting process, where incidents are reported to Emergency Dispatch, leading to an Animal Incident Report (AIR).
- **Section 7.c and 7.d** describe the escalation for "repeated incidents" or "bite incidents," which can result in a pet being designated a habitual nuisance and requiring removal from government housing.
- **Section 7.b** also mentions that appeals to an AIR can be made in writing to the Staff Judge Advocate (SJA) within five business days.

To ensure we make meaningful improvements, I need your help. Are these the sections that are causing concern? Is the lack of clarity related to the definition of a "nuisance," the steps in the reporting and appeal process, or the specific consequences for different infractions?

Your detailed feedback on these points will be invaluable. It will allow us to move beyond general concerns and address the core of the issue, ensuring our community is safe for all residents and fair to our responsible pet owners.
