

Off-Base Housing:

Security Deposits Transitioning to Electronic Payments

This higher headquarter directed security deposit policy change aligns NSA Naples with all other DoD bases across the world and will enable personnel to experience the convenience of electronic payments.

At the direction of higher headquarters, Commander, Navy Region Europe, Africa, Central (CNREURAFCENT), NSA Naples is transitioning to electronic fund transfer (EFT) for off-base housing security deposit to ensure that our personnel living off-base can expect the same processes and standards they would experience at all other DoD bases across the world.

If you're stationed in the Naples area, residing off-base, and paid your security deposit in cash, it will be returned to you electronically and you will pay it back to your landlord electronically. The housing office will contact you to sign two acknowledgement forms and a lease amendment to complete the process and go electronic.

This higher headquarter directed security deposit policy change aligns NSA Naples with all other DoD bases across the world and will enable our personnel to experience the convenience of electronic payments.

Electronic payment removes a layer of bureaucracy allowing tenants to receive their security deposit directly from the landlord instead of going through NSA Naples housing office. Quick and easy.

Furthermore, electronic payment is more convenient than taking a trip to the ATM to get cash and more secure than carrying cash around. Going electronic will also reduce and/or eliminate the potential for cash drain at installation ATMs.

In the modern era, electronic payments are the preferred method of monetary transactions for every other overseas station and keeps an electronic transaction history, vice dependence on paper payment receipts.

This change will ONLY affect tenant personnel residing offbase that have executed private lease agreements through the NSA Naples Housing Service Center (HSC) prior to 10 June 2024.

Personnel PCSing out of Italy by December 2025 will be grandfathered in and not be affected by this new policy.

The housing office will contact all concerned to sign two acknowledgement forms and a lease amendment to complete the process and go electronic.

Your Questions Answered

What if the landlord refuses to return the deposit?

A landlord who fails to return the deposit to a tenant would be subject to immediate removal from the NSA Naples housing program. It is an extremely rare occurrence to see a landlord who fails to return a security deposit back to tenant here in Naples. Per the lease agreement, and in rare instances where security deposit dispute between tenant and landlord cannot be resolved through informal meeting with the housing office, either party will have all remedies available to them under the law. As a DoD personnel, if you are not getting the legal help you need, you should always engage your chain of command to escalate the issue through appropriate channels.

Will the security deposit be returned in Euros?

Deposits are electronically returned in Euros if you provide account information that includes an IBAN number linked to a Euro bank account. If a tenant has a U.S. bank account, they will receive the money in dollars. Most personnel that own a community bank account have reported that it makes security deposit, rent, and bill payments to Italian landlords much easier. Other personnel are known to use the wire transfer service known as Wise. As for the exchange rate, this fluctuates on a daily basis and each tenant may realize a positive or negative difference between transactions depending on when the transaction occurs.

Is it my responsibility to inform my landlord about this policy change?

No. The housing service center will explain the policy change to each landlord.

Radon Awareness: How Radon Enters Homes

On-base residential and non-residential units, including off-base Government leased units are in compliance with the Navy Radon Management Program.

Radon can enter your home in many ways:

- Cracks in solid floors
- Construction joints
- · Cracks in walls
- Gaps in suspended floors
- · Gaps around
- service pipes

 Cavities inside
- walls
- The water supply

Radon is a naturally occurring, radioactive gas that is odorless, colorless, and tasteless. Radon gas is released from rocks and soil and can move to air, groundwater, and surface water. It is normally found at very low levels in outdoor air and can be found in water used for cooking and drinking.

In compliance with the Navy Radon Assessment and Mitigation Program (NAVRAMP), NSA Naples on-base residential and non-residential units, including off-base Government leased units are either tested or mitigated or currently being tested.

Personnel that live off-base have entered into a private contract with their landlord, therefore limiting the scope with which the U.S. government may intervene or have control over said contract. However, DoD personnel living off-base can work with their landlord to test for and mitigate radon, if desired, at their own expense. The lessee may work with the lessor to address any identified issues, as outlined in Section 19 of the NSA Naples housing lease.

While NSA Naples has a known overall potential for elevated radon levels, classifying the installation as a Radon Potential Category (RPC) 1 according to NAVRAMP, the installation is complying with NAVRAMP testing and mitigation policies at government owned/controlled units. RPC 1 is simply the level assigned when even one unit or building is found on the installation with a radon level over the minimum threshold of 4.0 picocuries per liter (pCi/L).

Naples Public Health Evaluation In-Focus: Food Safety in Naples

Food Inspection On-Base

One of Naples Public Health Evaluation's enduring processes is food safety, which seeks to ensure that food sold at the Commissary on U.S. Naval Support Activity, Naples Support Site is safe to eat and undergoes a rigorous process by the U.S. Army Veterinary Command (VETCOM) who serve as the local food inspectors before entering the store to be sold. The Commissary has labeled the fresh produce to inform shoppers of the area from which the produce is grown. Much of the produce in the Commissary is from Germany and Northern Italy.

Continuous Food Safety Monitoring

Food provided on base is monitored on an ongoing basis. The U.S. Naval Hospital Naples Preventive Medicine routinely inspects all dining facilities on base to ensure that food is properly stored, maintained, and prepared. In accordance with Department of Defense Directive 6400.4, VETCOM ensures inspectors are stationed in the Commissary and consistently monitor food products; all food products are from VETCOM-approved sources that have been inspected; buying from approved sources is required for all meat, dairy, eggs, prepared vegetables and bottled water (fresh produce is exempt in Western Europe); proper facility sanitation; personal hygiene practices of food service workers; and education of food service managers and employees about food safety.

Food Inspections Off-Base

The U.S. Government does not inspect restaurants or supermarkets off-base. Italy has a system in place to inspect Italian food facilities, markets, and suppliers. However, the health and well-being of all personnel and families in Naples is the base's top priority. VETCOM inspects Italian food manufacturing facilities producing food that is supplied to U.S. military installations.

Food Safety Tips

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services provides valuable sanitary practices that can apply wherever you live in the world:

- Wash fresh fruits and vegetables thoroughly with potable water prior to eating or cooking.
- Immune-compromised people should consume only cooked fruits and vegetables.
- Use separate cutting boards, plates and utensils for uncooked and cooked meats to avoid cross-contamination.
- Use a food thermometer to make sure meat is cooked to a safe temperature.
- Refrigerate hot or cold leftover food within two hours of being served. Keep leftovers for three to four days when properly refrigerated.

What Is Naples Public Health Evaluation (NPHE)?

The Naples Public Health Evaluation is a comprehensive study of the health risks associated with potential exposure to chemicals in the environment resulting from the area's waste disposal practices. The Campania region of Italy has experienced numerous challenges associated with trash collection, open burning of uncollected trash and illegal waste disposal practices. In response to health concerns expressed by U.S. Navy personnel in 2007, the Commander, Navy Region Europe, Africa, Central (CNREURAFCENT) contacted the Navy and Marine Corps Force Health Protection Command (NMCFHPC) to conduct a comprehensive public health evaluation to assess the potential health risks for U.S. personnel living in the Naples area. The NPHE was conducted from January 2008 to June 2011.

What did the Navy learn from NPHE?

Through the Public Health Evaluation, the Navy has been able to identify and address public health risks for U.S. personnel living in the Campania region. The Navy established new health-protective policies and took immediate action to protect the health of U.S. personnel and their families. Many of these health-protective policies remain in place, as enduring processes, to ensure continued health protection beyond the life of the study.

Your Health: Facts for Families in Naples About: Food On and Off-Base

The U.S. Navy is committed to ensuring our families are safe while serving our country at home or overseas. The following information is provided as part of a wide-ranging effort to understand the health risks of our personnel and families living in Naples, Italy. A comprehensive Public Health Evaluation was conducted to assess potential short and long-term health risks associated with living in the Naples area (see left panel). In line with our commitment to continually share important health information, we encourage you to review the following information.

In 2007, numerous reports of high dioxin levels and other chemicals in air, water, and soil created a concern amongst the U.S. Navy community that foods grown in the Campania region could be contaminated. Articles in newspapers and in some Italian scientific journals alleged links between adverse health effects and the toxic waste dumps in the Campania region. These articles implicated locally grown vegetables, fruits, and mozzarella di bufala as possibly contaminated foods.

As part of the Navy's overall efforts to be protective of the health of U.S. military and civilian personnel and their families in Naples, the Navy and U.S. Army Veterinary Command (VETCOM) conducted an investigation of foods produced in the Campania region and sold in the Naples Gricignano D'Aversa Navy Commissary (Commissary). The food study was performed in February 2008.

VETCOM is the Department of Defense executive agent for food safety and quality assurance and is responsible for providing direct assistance to all DOD agencies requiring support with respect to food safety and food defense.

Although there are multiple layers of health protection already in place for U.S. personnel purchasing food items at the Commissary, the presumed higher potential for environmental contaminants to be present in the Campania region led the Naples Public Health Evaluation team to conduct a food study. The study went beyond routine inspections of food products by performing various laboratory analyses, which are normally not mandated by VETCOM. Foods grown locally, particularly fresh fruits and vegetables, received a closer look.

Using the above criteria, an assessment of the Commissary was conducted. Products that met the food study criteria and were thus evaluated in the study included:

- · Artichokes · Celery · Spinach
- · Cabbage Carrots
- Chicken

NSA Naples Observes National Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention Month (SAAPM)

April was Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention Month (SAAPM). Capt. John Randazzo, installation commander, signed a proclamation declaring that NSA Naples would observe this campaign and take a united stand against sexual assault.

Sexual assault is the most underreported crime in our society and in the Military. While the Department of Defense prefers that sexual assault incidents are reported to the command to activate both victims' services and law enforcement actions, it recognizes that some victims desire only healthcare and advocacy services and do not want command or law enforcement involvement. The Department believes its first priority is for victims to be treated with dignity and respect and to receive the medical treatment, mental health counseling, and the advocacy services that they deserve.

Under DoD SAPR Policy, Service members and their adult military dependents have two reporting options: Unrestricted Reporting and Restricted Reporting.

<u>Unrestricted Reports</u> allow adult victims of sexual assault to report crimes without requesting confidentiality of their allegations. DoD law enforcement initiates

an investigation, and the chain of command is notified. Unrestricted Reporting allows victims to receive medical treatment, advocacy services, legal support, and eligibility for expedited transfer. In addition, Unrestricted Reporting allows victims of sexual assault to report retaliation in the SAPR program.


Restricted Reports allow adult victims of sexual assault to confidentially report the crime to specified individuals without triggering an investigation. Information provided to the chain of command does not reveal personally identifying information about the victim or alleged offender. Restricted Reporting allows the victim to receive legal advice, medical treatment, and advocacy services.

Regardless of which reporting option is chosen, or if no report is filed, there are <u>dedicated response personnel</u> available to provide advocacy, information, and resources to victims of sexual assault. More information is available in the <u>Victim Reporting Options Guide</u>.

Terminate Government Quarters

It is important to know that if you are leaving base housing for any reason, including PCS you are required to have an in person appointment to give 30 day notice and you must contact the assignment office to schedule an appointment.

1st Appointment at Housing Service center

- The Assignment office is located at the Support Site Facility Building 2072 and is open Monday through Friday, from 7:45: a.m. Until 3:45p.m. Contact the office at DSN 629-4930 to schedule your first appointment.
- Bring a copy of your PCS orders to this first appointment. You will complete an "Intent to Vacate" notice and schedule your preliminary and final inspections. The Assignment Counselor will arrange for loaner furniture to be delivered and picked up.

2nd Appointment at your Apartment

- During the pre-inspection of your home, the Housing representative will inform you of what will be expected at the final checkout, as well as take notes of needed repairs. During the pre-inspection, be sure to ask any questions you may have concerning items that have been lost or damaged. This inspection will take approximately 60 minutes.
- Please make arrangements to keep this pre-inspection appointment. Missing the appointment will slow up the vacating process.

3rd Appointment at your Apartment

- You must have a final inspection of your home in order to complete your requirements for vacating government quarters before PCSing. To complete the final inspection it is important to have all personal property removed prior to your scheduled appointment.
- At the final inspection a Housing representative will examine the residence in the following areas: condition and cleanliness of quarters; and inventory, condition and cleanliness of government equipment, appliances and loaner furniture. During the final inspection, you will sign a memorandum indicating the date that you passed your final inspection and vacated quarters.
- Following your final inspection you will need to report to the Assignment Office for your final BAH and signature of the check-out sheet.

Please ensure that your dryer is empty, as we will be conducting cleaning of the dryer exhaust vents. Scheduled maintenance helps keep our community in top-notch condition, ensuring your homes are comfortable and running smoothly. By completing these routine checks, we can address any potential issues before they become major headaches. Remember, your cooperation is invaluable in maintaining the quality of life we all enjoy here. It is a collective effort that keeps our community thriving. So, let's work together to keep our homes happy and healthy!

What is a Preventive Maintenance Inspection (PMI)?

A Preventive Maintenance Inspection is a proactive process aimed at preventing and addressing potential maintenance issues in residential properties before they become a serious problem. Here at NSA Naples, we do PMI's in the spring and fall seasons.

Pet Responsibility

As pet parents, we have the responsibility to care for and protect our furry friends. It's important to remember that having pets in Support Site housing is a privilege, and with that comes the responsibility of following the rules that keep both our pets and community safe. Please note that it is against the pet policy to have your pet's off-leash in common areas or left alone on balconies. These rules are in place to ensure the safety of your pets and everyone in the neighborhood. Pets should always be supervised and kept in secure environments to prevent accidents or injuries. Check-Ins

Sponsors are required to reserve a room 30 days in advance. They must provide a copy of the incoming member's orders, flight itinerary, and DOD ID at least 14 days before arrival. If your flight is delayed and you arrive after hours please contact the UH Duty Manager at +39 338-946-2227.

Check-Outs

For Check-outs, please stop by the UH front desk and schedule a pre inspection 14 days before your estimated departure. Final inspections are conducted on the day of departure and an E6 or above must be present in uniform.

Exception to Policy for UH Assignment

If you are an E-4 and below without dependents who is assigned to UH and you have previously received Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) or Overseas Housing Allowance (OHA) may request to reside off-base and to receive OHA, without the need for occupancy levels to reach 95%. All members under consideration for this category must submit a special request to the CO via their chain of command, UH, Manager and Housing Director. As proof a LES statement and house hold goods at least 2000 IBS will need to be submitted. Please note furniture purchased locally will not meet the requirement. If your ETP is approved at that time you will start the process to move into the economy.

NO PERSON UNDER 18 YEARS OF AGE IS AUTHORIZED IN THE UH

Residents are encouraged to invite guests, provided they do not interfere with good order or inconvenience other residents. Each resident is authorized to have up to five guests, with a maximum of five guests per unit at any given time. Guests must be accompanied by the host resident at all times, who is responsible for their behavior.

The authorized visiting hours for guests are:

Sunday-Thursday: 1200 to 2200 Friday-Saturday: 1200 to 0000

Overnight stays by guests are not permitted. Visitors include personnel in the unit for official duties such as command representatives, security, maintenance, cleaning, and inspection workers.



Local Lens: Unveiling Campania's Hidden Gems

Tucked away on the slopes of Mount Caruso near the small town of Foglianise, in the province of Benevento, lies a hidden sanctuary where time seems to stand still: the Hermitage of San Michele. This centuries-old cave-chapel, carved into the rock, has long served as a sacred space for solitude, prayer, and connection with nature.

Today, the hermitage is experiencing a quiet revival, thanks to the dedication of a local volunteer group called La Via Silente. Committed to preserving local heritage, these young residents have taken on the care of the site—clearing trails, guiding visitors, and organizing cultural and spiritual gatherings.

Reaching the hermitage requires a gentle 30-minute trekking walk through chestnut woods and along natural springs. The reward is not only a breathtaking view over the Vitulano Valley but also a profound sense of peace. "People come here to listen to silence," says Anna, one of the volunteers. "But they also rediscover a deeper connection—with the land, with time, and with themselves."

In a fast-moving world, places like the Hermitage of San Michele remind us of the value of slowness and simplicity. It is not just a historical site—it's a living symbol of community, memory, and mindful presence.

And after the long walk you can take the chance to discover local products with tradition, quiet and resilience in a place that preserves a space of meaning and beauty—off the radar, but

Tenant Commands are encouraged to add "RLSO Legal Clearance Checkout" in their respective Command Checkout Sheet to ensure all personnel meet this important requirement.

Before departing Italy on PCS orders, all personnel must complete the following checkout procedures:

Upcoming Demolition of B443 at Capodichino: Four Things to Know

The demolition of Building B443 is scheduled to begin around May 2025. B443 is the former barracks; the long structure located behind the Mobile Bar. This demo project will necessitate some changes that all tenants should be aware of and plan for accordingly.

Mobile Bar Relocation - Enjoy Uninterrupted Service!

To ensure continued service during the B443 demolition, the Mobile Bar will be temporarily relocated to a new spot near B447. For reference, B447 is located opposite the C4I entrance area. Don't worry, the current Mobile Bar will remain open until the new location is ready! We'll share more details about the move, including the opening date of the temporary location, as soon as they are available.

BBQ Pit Temporal Closure Starting in Late March 2025

As part of the Mobile Bar's relocation project, the BBQ pit near Building B447 will be temporarily closed from around end of March to April 2025. This closure will allow for the installation of essential utilities at the Mobile Bar's new temporary location.

Outage of Smoking Area Near Mobile Bar

The Smoking Area/Gazebo located near the Mobile Bar and B443 will be closed starting in April 2025 until project completion, anticipated in summer 2026.

Pedestrian Traffic Detour

For your safety during the B443 demolition project, a pedestrian detour will be in effect starting in April 2025. The detour will remain in place until project completion, anticipated in Summer 2026. Please follow posted detour signs and exercise caution while navigating the area.




