How familiar are you with the Requirement for Bottled Water at off-base housing?

The U.S. Navy is committed to ensuring our families are safe while serving at home or overseas.

This message aligns with NSA Naples commitment to promote awareness of important health information.

A comprehensive public health evaluation completed for NSA Naples in 2011 identified potential public health risks at some off-base housing locations, and implemented a number of “Enduring Processes” to reduce or eliminate potential public health risks. One of the most important Enduring Processes requires landlords to provide containerized (bottled) water from a Navy-approved vendor. This requirement is included in lease agreements for all off-base housing arranged through the NSA Naples Housing Office. You may not negotiate or agree to have this requirement removed from your lease agreement.

As additional information, drinking water supplies for Capodichino, Support Site (including Base-Housing), SATCOM Lago Patria, Carney Park, and Gaeta Olde Mill Inn, are in compliance with US EPA DW standards, and the water is safe to drink. Tap water at Gaeta FLC is not fit for human consumption. Bottled water is supplied to Gaeta FLC. Irrigation water is not potable and is not fit for human consumption at any NSA Naples installation.

NBHC Capodichino Adult ADFM and DoD Employee Primary Care

NBHC Capodichino is phasing-in over the next 90-days adult primary care services to all eligible TRICARE beneficiaries and, on a fee-for-service basis, DoD civilian and contractor staff members. To preserve Active Duty medical readiness for military operations, non-Active Duty beneficiaries and DoD staff may experience delays or temporary inability in being seen at the clinic. Adult TRICARE beneficiaries can choose to have their PCM at the clinic and can book appointments within 24-hours or in the future. DoD civilian and contractor staff can receive

primary care, but are limited to booking same-day, space-available appointments. Appointments are made by walking-in or calling 081-811-6000 (DSN: 629-6000) and selecting option 2 then 2 again. Eligibility questions should be directed to the TRICARE office at 081-811-6330 (DSN: 629-6330). Please be patient as we work through these new processes. - Active duty service member medical readiness remains Capo clinic's top priority.
- It is recommended that individuals take into account the regular traffic delays, limited parking capacity, and the limited clinical capabilities that will be encountered at Capodichino when deciding at which Primary Care clinic they will choose for their enrollment.
- COVID-19 screenings of symptomatic TRICARE beneficiaries and U.S. civilian employees remain available.
- The decision to open Primary Care to a larger patient population was made in response to tenant command feedback and in an effort to increase access to care to all eligible beneficiaries and mission essential staff.

SAT and ACT fees (and other related benefits) may be waived or reduced for eligible low-income students. AP fees may be waived or reduced for eligible low-income students not registered with DoDEA. School counselors, test coordinators, or representatives of authorized agencies request fee waivers for eligible students. Please communicate your request for benefits to a school admin, counselor, coordinator or School Liaison (SL) for coordination.

All high school students in grades 9th through 12th enrolled in an AP course will take the corresponding AP Exam. High school students not currently enrolled in a DoDEA AP course(s) who wish to take the regularly scheduled AP Exam and are eligible for enrollment in a DoDEA school on a tuition-free basis, their parent/sponsor must submit a written request to the principal which includes the parents/sponsors' name and contact information, student's name, high school student is currently enrolled in, grade level, title of the AP Exam and the reason for the request. If a high school student has unusual circumstance that prevents them from participating during the regularly scheduled AP Exam, the parent/sponsor must submit a written request to the principal for Late AP Exams approval.

Separately, the ACT International Student Fee Waivers are available at the NMHS Counseling office. This waiver is intended for all students who are signing up and taking the ACT. The waiver removes the International Fee from the cost of sign-up so that all NMHS students pay the same as students taking the ACT stateside. A new waiver must be used each time a student signs up to take an ACT exam and the unique serial number on the waiver has to be entered at the time of online payment.

Ongoing: PCS Arrival Trend: Lack of Interim Schooling

We are currently seeing the following trend with new arrivals to NSA Naples. Due to the backlog of visa processing in the US, sponsors are arriving without their spouse and children. The commonality is that the remaining family has left the previous house, school district and state to live with extended family members elsewhere while they await their visa processing. Additionally, the common anticipated visa processing date stated is October with no guarantee. During the interim time, the spouse is unable to register the children in the visiting local school system due to a lack of residency documentation (lease, utilities, orders, etc.). Upon arrival, students in grades 7-12 not currently enrolled in an accredited curriculum during their transition period may be given the option to provide make-up work during the course of regular work or may be assessed to determine the current course grade. The longer the gap, the more problematic this will become for placement or grade completion. Please communicate to your sponsors that prolonged absence from an accredited curriculum may have an impact, especially the higher in secondary school they are. If you applied for the FARM Program, please ensure that the income information that you provided was accurate and that you only included the required incomes. Please note that OHA, BAH, LQA, Combat Pay, foster care payments, and other payments as described in the Tip Sheet are excluded from the income families are required to report on their application. If you need to resubmit your FARM application with the correct income, please do so in your Student Meal Account.

Ongoing: Status of the registration and re-registration process

If you currently have a child enrolled in school, please do not request an Aspen account. All sponsor and spouse contacts, attached to an active DoDEA student, have active Aspen accounts that can be used to check grades and attendance for students in grades 4-12. If you need assistance accessing your account, please contact the school registrar. At present, families who have incoming Kindergarten students and want to register students for next school year are unable to select SY 2023-2024. We want to assure you that DoDEA HQ is aware of this issue and is working hard to make this option available as soon as possible.

We also want to update you on the Online Re-Registration system (OLRR). DoDEA is currently working to develop and deploy the system. We expect the launch to be in late March/early April. Families will be notified how to access their Aspen account and re-register students for next year.

We understand that this process may be frustrating, and we appreciate your patience as we work to provide you with the best possible registration and re-registration experience. We will provide further updates as we receive them from DoDEA HQ.

Despite recent public discussion to the contrary, nearly all colleges and universities still require/use scores from these tests as part of their admission decision-making process and scholarships. We recommend that students take the SAT/ACT in the Spring of their sophomore year or Fall/Winter of their junior year, and that all DoDEA students take at least one of these tests prior to graduation from high school. Please work with your counselor on deciding which test(s) are best for your needs. 1. Meal prices are \$3.50 for grades K-5 and \$3.75 for grades 6-12. Reduced prices are \$0.40 for all grade levels. Pre-payments for school meals can be made at <https://family.titank12.com>. Please select district 'DoDEA-Alexandria, Virginia' to link your student to the online account. Pre-payments are also accepted at the local NEX customer service desk.
2. A complete lunch meal consists of 1 entrée, 2 fruits, 2 vegetables, and a milk. A child must select at minimum 3 of the 5 offered components, with one component a fruit or vegetable.
3. Students are permitted one meal at the pricing indicated in bullet 1. After the first meal purchase, all other purchases will be sold as a la carte. A la carte purchases will be subject to availability of account funds.
4. A la carte prices are as follows:
Non-Student Breakfast: \$4.00
Non-Student Lunch: \$7.00
Lunch Plus (Additional Entrée): \$2.25
Fruit (1/2 cup): \$1.00
Vegetable (1/2 cup): \$1.00

Milk: \$2.00

5. All students enrolled in DoDEA schools are eligible to participate in the local school lunch program. At no time will a student be denied a school meal, regardless of account balance. A la carte purchases will be subject to availability of account funds.

PROPER MAILING PRACTICES

Our mailing regional supply/post office, [NAVSUP Fleet Logistics Center Sigonella \(FLCSI\)](#) is reporting an increase in packages being sent from BOTH CONUS and OCONUS mail facilities being returned-to-sender (RTS) by USPS for not meeting Global Trade Compliance (GTC) customs form requirements.

Most GTC compliance issues that result in RTS for mail leaving overseas military post offices with destination addresses CONUS have been due to customers writing vague descriptions on the customs forms or attempting to mail prohibited or restricted items.

In order to ensure your packages are delivered, NAVSUP FLCSI encourages all patrons to use the following tips:

- Contact your installation's or ship's postal officer with questions about sending mail and packages via MPS.
- When completing mail customs forms, it is necessary to clearly and precisely describe the package's contents. Otherwise, mailers risk non-compliance with GTC regulations that could result in the package being returned-to-sender (RTS).

- Volunteer services will not exceed 5-days or 40-hours per week
- Must fill out the FLCSI Postal Activity Volunteer Form (attached)
- Must have an orientation for standard of conduct, command procedures, and safety briefs
- Volunteers under the age of 18 years will have parental consent, and age under 16YO are not permitted to volunteer
- Must coordinate volunteer times with my volunteer POCs: RS2 Camacho and LS2 Gyamfi to avoid overcrowding prior to starting of volunteer day
- Volunteer timelines will be provided to the volunteers upon contacting the POCs
- Will be required to sign in via deck log during their volunteer days
- Group volunteers can coordinate with RSC Tapia to block a day/time

MONTHLY SUPPORT SITE POST OFFICE TRAINING

On the third Thursday of every month the Support Site Post Office package pickup hours will be 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. to support postal clerk training.

DO NOT MAIL ALCOHOL through USPS! 100% of ALL Mail entering and leaving Italy is X-Rayed! Please be aware when shipping and receiving packages that items such as wine, cologne (and other items containing alcohol over .05%), kinder eggs, weapons (including airsoft guns), etc. are prohibited from being shipped through USPS. Packages mailed from Naples that are flagged with prohibited items will be inspected and if containing unauthorized material will not be shipped! For a complete list of prohibited/restricted items or questions concerning our inspection processes please speak with your local post office representative or contact the postal team at 626-5370.

Express Mail

Express mail service is available at the Fleet Mail Center and the Support Site Post Office Monday through Thursday. Friday and Saturday service is unavailable due to mail transportation schedules unable to meet the required express mail delivery time table.

CHANGING MAIL BOX LOCATION

Want to move your mail pick up to another base? Now is your chance! The Post Office is allowing sponsors to shift their mail boxes to their desired location. Follow the steps below:

1. Go to the location you want to move to. Request to move your PSC receptacle to the new location. Clerk will give you a box number and the address associated with the box number.
2. Next go to your current PSC receptacle location and close your current PSC receptacle by providing the clerk with your new address (To input in the Directory Program).
3. Once you have completed the first two steps you can go to your new location, fill out a PSC agreement and receive your new combination. At this point your address has changed and you will need to submit a change of address.
4. Go to www.usps.com to change your address.

*Note: Naples postal will forward your mail to the new PSC address for one year and then Return to Sender all mail addressed to old PSC receptacle.
