PIONEERS OF CHANGE:

SHAPING THE FUTURE TOGETHER

National Hispanic Heritage Month (NHHM) commemorates the many achievements and cultures of Hispanic Americans. Celebrated from September 15th through October 15th, it is the only Department of Defense special observance to span multiple months, coinciding with Independence Day celebrations for several Latin American countries.

During this time of year, the Department of Defense (DoD) honors the Hispanic Americans who have sacrificed for, contributed to, and served our great nation.

The 2024 NHHM theme is "Pioneers of Change: Shaping the Future Together." This theme emphasizes the Hispanic Americans who have sacrificed to create a better future for the Nation and all Americans.

The future is impacted by leaders of bravery, humanitarianism, and selflessness. One such person was Roberto Clemente.

Clemente was a legendary Puerto Rican baseball player who faced adversary, served his country, became a champion, and sacrificed everything to help others.

Born in 1934 in Carolina, Puerto Rico, he spent his young life playing track and field sports as well as baseball. At just 17 years old, he began playing for the Santurce Crabbers. By 1954, he was scouted and signed by the Brooklyn Dodgers.

The following year, he joined the Pittsburgh Pirates, an organization upon which he would leave an indelible mark. While there, he enlisted in the Marine Corps in 1958, as a Reserve infantryman. For the following 6 years, he spent his offseasons serving his country.

With his iconic "21" jersey, Clemente dominated with the Pirates starting in 1960, when they defeated the New York Yankees in the World Series.

He is noted as one of the best right fielders in baseball history. When the Pirates won the World Series again in 1971, Clemente won the Most Valuable Player Award.

In the early 1970s, he secured sponsorships for baseball clinics in Puerto Rico, coached an amateur baseball team in Nicaragua, and worked on plans to build a sports complex for underprivileged children.

In 1972, a devastating earthquake struck Nicaragua. Clemente raised over \$150,000 and 26 tons of food, clothing, and medicine to help. On his way to transport supplies to those impacted, his plane crashed, and he tragically died. However, his legacy of humanitarianism lives on.

Clemente said, "Any time you have an opportunity to make a difference in this world and you don't, then you are wasting your time on Earth."

Through selfless service, helping others, and sacrifice, Clemente shaped the future for countless others.

National Disability Employment Awareness Month (NDEAM) recognizes the contributions by those with disabilities who make our Nation great.

Led by the U.S. Department of Labor's Office (DOL) of Disability Employment Policy, NDEAM reaffirms the Department of Defense's (DoD) commitment to recruit and advance disabled individuals throughout its workforce. The DOL has chosen the theme, "Access to Good Jobs for All."

People with disabilities are part of a diverse group that includes people with sensory, physical, and mental conditions. Disabilities cross the lines of age, ethnicity, sex, race, sexual orientation, and socioeconomic status.

Almost everyone is likely to experience some form of disability—temporary or permanent—at some point in their life.

Do you know about Olmstead v. L.C.?

Olmstead v. L.C. is considered the most important Supreme Court case for disabled members' civil rights. 2024 marks the 25th anniversary of this key decision, which expanded the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and bolstered the independent living movement.

The case was brought by Lois Curtis and Elaine Wilson after they were kept in Georgia mental institutions despite being recommended for community-based treatment.

As a result of neglect towards them, attorney Sue Jamieson filed a lawsuit on their behalf against the Georgia Department of Human Resources.

At the Supreme Court, the justices ruled in favor of the women, asserting that they had been unfairly segregated into institutions alongside others with disabilities.

The ruling specified that individuals with disabilities had the right to receive treatment in integrated settings if they choose, with their doctors' approval, and provided that the accommodations are reasonable. In the years since, the Olmstead decision has served as the basis of several other decisions that have increased the rights of disabled individuals.

Olmstead v. L.C. has allowed disabled individuals greater autonomy and freedom from discrimination. It tested the strength of the ADA and has served as the bedrock for Federal Government policies in providing opportunities for independent living and employment.

Nobody should be held back from access to job opportunities because of a disability. People with disabilities offer important, unique perspectives that can make the workplace, and our Nation at large, better. The DoD recognizes this and strives to build an inclusive workforce for total force readiness.

Stabilization for Sailors with High School Seniors

Distribution Guidance Memorandum (DGM) #0405-1609

Purpose: Establishes procedures that afford active duty Navy families the ability to remain in the same geographic location to complete a dependent's senior year of high school.

Background: Working group developed strategies to reduce the Sailors choosing to execute a voluntary unaccompanied tour.

Action as follows:

- Applicable service members are those whose projected rotation dates (PRD) occur between the
 month of the first day of the high school dependent's junior year and the month of the high school
 graduation date. Stabilization may be achieved in one of the following ways:
 - The service member may request to extend in their current duty station or execute a
 permanent change of assignment (PCA) to a new command in the current geographic
 location, enabling the dependent to complete their last two years of high school.
 - For service members whose PRD months are before the first day of the dependent's junior
 year, on receipt of PCS orders the member may execute a PCS move to the Sailor's next duty
 station up to prior to the commencement of the dependent's junior year enabling high school
 stability for the dependent's senior year.
- Service members with an applicable dependent shall ensure the dependent is enrolled in DEERS
 and listed on the service members' NAVPERS 1070/602 as residing at the same residence as the
 service member.
- A guidance counselor or appointed school representative from the dependent's school shall submit
 an official memorandum verifying the dependent's required information.




